The minutes of the **March 26 Special Meeting** were presented. Mrs. Lattimer moved, Mrs. Stranman seconded that the reading of the minutes be waived; motion CARRIED. Mrs. Lattimer moved, Mrs. Stranman seconded to adopt the minutes. The President reported he was at the meeting and called the meeting to order. There being no further corrections, the minutes were approved as amended.

CITY MANAGER'S REPORT

Planning & Community Development Department

The City Manager requested an ordinance to put the new Planning & Community Development Department in place, in accordance with the Memorandum of Understanding with AFSCME, Council 8, Local 1197 Union and the City of Ashtabula. Mrs. Lattimer moved, Mrs. Stranman seconded to grant the Manager's request; motion CARRIED.

Ohio Department of Transportation – Transportation Enhancement Funding

The City Manager requested an ordinance to apply for funds and execute all necessary project documents for the Ohio Department of Transportation's – Transportation Enhancement Funding program. The City of Ashtabula will seek funding for approximately \$220,000, with a 20% match, to complete the Point Park Stairway project. The design engineering for this project is complete and payment was made as part of the funds allocated during the original Enhancement funding, which was Goodwill Drive. Mrs. Lattimer moved, Mrs. Stranman seconded to grant the Manager's request. The Manager reported the match must be in place next year. The motion CARRIED.

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Health District Licensing Council

The City Manager requested the reappointment of Mr. David Hoffman to the Health District licensing Council, effective immediately with a term to expire February 4, 2017. Mrs. Lattimer moved, Mrs. Stranman seconded to grant the Manager's request; motion CARRIED.

Records Commission

The City Manager requested the reappointment of Mr. Jason Strong to the Records Commission, effective immediately with a term to expire January 1, 2014. Mrs. Lattimer moved, Mrs. Stranman seconded to grant the Manager's request; motion CARRIED.

East 6th Street Café

The City Manager reported bids to raze the structure have been accepted. He hopes to bring the final bids to the next regular meeting for Council's approval.

QUESTIONS AND/OR COMMENTS FOR THE MANAGER

Chapman's Store (State Road): The Ward 4 Councilor asked that the door located at the back of the business, (which business is now closed), be secured. The Manager will check on the status of the Councilor's request.

Junk at a Lake Avenue Residence: The Vice President reported on the deplorable condition of a vacant/foreclosed Lake Avenue residence located next door to the Salvation Army. The Manager explained the City's attempts to rectify the unsightliness. He said the person listed as the owner on the Ashtabula County Auditor's website claims they are no longer responsible, which is where it stands. The Solicitor reported, "This is unfortunately a misconception that a lot of people share. That when the bank sends out a notice of foreclosure or even files for foreclosure that at this point you are no longer responsible for the property – you've somehow lost it. Title doesn't transfer until title transfers. And title transfers at the conclusion of a foreclosure process, after public sale, and upon the issuance upon a Sheriff's deed. Until that time the property remains in the name of, and is technically under the control of, the titled owner – the person who bought it with the bank loan that is being foreclosed upon. It is very frustrating to people who can no longer afford properties and who have attempted, sometimes repeatedly or over a long period of time, to turn ownership to the property over to the bank which is threatening foreclosure and seeking to collect the debt – saying please, by all means satisfy the debt with the property, if you can. The banks, of course, or inundated with these repoed properties and they are no longer rushing to accept deeds in lieu of foreclosures. They're not rushing to complete foreclosures, and they're not even rushing to file the foreclosures any more. They're only doing that which is required to keep their regulators off their backs. So we have a lot of properties in limbo. But, technically, the City is within its rights to cite and to prosecute the person who still has title to the property.

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It may not seem fair; it may not be fair, but it is what the City is within its rights to do so.” The Manager will follow up with the City’s Housing Department to see what the next course of action should be. The Ward 2 Councilor asked if something could be done before the Easter Sunday traffic converges on the area, given St Joseph’s Church is directly across the street.

CITY SOLICITOR’S REPORT

Amnesty Day: The Solicitor offered a reminder that the Ashtabula City Municipal Court is holding an Amnesty Day on Saturday, April 14, from 9:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. Outstanding, non-violent warrants (a list of which will be posted on the first floor of the City Hall Annex) may be taken care of without fear of jail time. He suggested participants come with a minimum of \$150.00 to pay on their warrant, said payment plans will be made, if necessary. Attorneys and volunteer Solicitor Office and Municipal Court staff will be present. This program enables persons with non-violent warrants to get a “Fresh Start”.

2010 Census: The Solicitor reported under the requirements of the Ashtabula City Charter and the Ohio Revised Code, Council has a responsibility, when a new Census result is available, of checking and making sure the City’s five (5) wards remain approximately equal in population (which has no bearing on the registered or active voters), but in terms of overall population. He reported he began looking into the census results last year. At that time, and a few times since then, the Census data was only available for the whole City; it was not broken down by precinct, ward, or street-by-street to determine if ward boundaries need to be realigned. The Solicitor will attempt to get the information necessary for Council to meet their obligations.

Reducing Precincts: The Solicitor reported the Ashtabula County Board of Elections wants to reduce the number of precincts in Ashtabula County in order to lessen election costs. He said he will have to research to determine if this is allowed without knowing the populous numbers.

QUESTIONS AND/OR COMMENTS FOR THE CITY SOLICITOR

Reducing Precincts: The Ward 4 Councilor commented that the BOE would like to move sooner rather than later on reducing precincts. The Solicitor said he will look into this based on the comments made above about this subject.

Question to the City Manager

K-9 Program: The President reported it was recently announced that the K-9 Program would be suspended on April 1, but has since been extended. The Manager announced the Program’s suspension was extended to April 15 to continue to perform due diligence in disposing of the Program.

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ACTING CITY AUDITOR'S (ACA) REPORT

Income Tax Collections: The ACA reported Collections are up about \$20,000 compared to the same time in 2011. This can fluctuate daily depending on the number of returns.

Legislation Request: The Acting City Auditor requested an ordinance renaming Walnut Beach/Parks & Recreation Fund 233 to Parks & Recreation Fund 233. Mrs. Lattimer moved, Mrs. Stranman seconded the Acting Auditor's request; motion CARRIED.

Sewer/Trash Billing: The President asked if billing is current. The Acting Auditor replied yes.

The Ward 2 Councilor announced the location to be the former Hulbert Restaurant; and that he had no objection to the request. Mrs. Lattimer moved, Mrs. Stranman seconded, not to request a hearing; motion CARRIED.

MISCELLANEOUS BUSINESS

The Ward 2 Councilor read the following statement, “I’m sure that at one time or another everyone has tried to assemble a puzzle of many pieces. When the puzzle is complete you will have the full picture of the subject. When you lose one or more pieces to the puzzle the identity is lost. This is occurring in the City of Ashtabula. The pieces for the puzzle of the City are being lost and lost forever. In the last 10 to 15 years factories were closing and moving elsewhere; our population was decreasing; the high school was built outside the City; and now there’s talk that churches may close. What’s next to move or close? Could it be the large complex on Lake Avenue that employs hundreds of employees? No one knows until it’s too late. Like last week’s surprise announcement of Saints John and Paul Schools leaving the City; and, leaving behind a lot of history, dedication, and hard work by many, many families who helped build Mt. Carmel School and strongly supported Saint John High School through the years. Ashtabula is self-destructing. It seems no one cares to look for the missing pieces of the puzzle, instead keeps continuing the dismantling of the City. In one breathe we are trying to encourage industries from other areas to move to Ashtabula in our new industrial park. Then in another breathe decisions are being made to move very important operations out of the City. This cannot continue. It’s time for everyone to realize the effect it has, and will have, on the City for years to come. As we all know if you continue cutting the roots of the tree, the tree will soon die, and eventually fall to the ground.” The President thanked his colleague and told him he very much appreciated his comments.

PUBLIC'S GENERAL PORTION

Mr. Michael Wagner, 436 West 38th Street: asked for the status of a few residential structures on Station Avenue, and some located between West 40th and 41st Streets that should be razed. The Manager reported 9 structures are being pursued with the remaining \$100,000 in NSP (Neighborhood Stabilization Program) funds; East 6th Street Café being one of them. A significant number of structures have been removed from Station Avenue; and it is not known whether more are able to be razed with the remaining NSP dollars. The City has contacted some of the property owners about the cleanup of their properties. The Manager said he would try and get information on the structures if someone is interested in purchasing them. The Manager confirmed a structure on West 38th Street is on the list to be razed.

Mr. Wagner asked if these abandoned structures may be purchase for less than the back taxes owed on them. The Solicitor said, "You have really hit the nail on the head in terms of urban redevelopment. There's no easy mechanism for getting rid of back taxes and assessments on these properties that we're trying desperately to get back into the economy as useful properties. The only method with which I am familiar is when it reaches a certain point the auditor (County) can conduct a delinquent land sale. The property can then be sold through that process for an amount less than appraisal; and an amount less than the taxes that are due and owing. It's basically whoever bids the most gets the property. They hold these every couple of years. There used to be investors who would just go in and bid, and bid, and bid just for the sake of owning land that might be useful some day. We're not seeing as much of that. But we may need to ask the County Auditor to do something like that for us, because we have torn down a significant number of properties whose title is in limbo (there's an owner, a bank, or the owner isn't well known, the bank isn't taking care of it, and there's thousands of dollars in taxes, as you pointed out. We, as a City, can't waive those taxes; we don't collect those, the County does. The County Auditor really doesn't have the authority to waive those taxes because they've been assessed and they're owed to the county, the library districts, the school districts, etc. But, through this process, if all else fails, they can be sold through a delinquent or forfeited land sale. And, we just have to try and get that process moving."

The Ward 4 Councilor thanked Mr. Wagner for being a "great advocate for his neighborhood".

Mr. Leonard Deneen, 5021 Crystal Avenue: reported that last month he complained about unbundled yard waste. Since then he has watched City crews pickup all the debris; and "commended them for doing something they did not have to do; and for doing a fantastic job."

The President told Mr. Wagner he knows it is frustrating that a person is able to drive the City and identify hundreds of structures that should be addressed by being "seriously improved, if not demolished".

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He has spent a significant amount of time in the Manager's office talking about the structures and trying to figure out which to tackle because they are all equally deserving of attention. He hopes more funding will be secured, coupled with finding creative ways to address these structures because they are "surely a blight on a lot of our neighborhoods." He thanked Mr. Wagner for being one of the citizens who still works to keep their property up.
