CITY MANAGER'S REPORT

Adams Services, Inc. – Asbestos Abatement/Demolition

The City Manager requested an ordinance to enter into an agreement with Adams Services, Inc., of 672 State Route 45 S., Austinburg, OH 44010, in the amount not to exceed \$27,850.00 for the purpose of asbestos abatement and demolition to properties located at 3410/3412 Station Avenue, Ashtabula, OH. Funds for this expenditure will be taken from Account Number 290-182-5485. Mr. Pugliese moved, Mr. Hamrick seconded to grant the City Manager's request; motion CARRIED.

Transfer Station Closed

The City Manager announced the Transfer Station will be closed on July 23 and 24 for scheduled compactor maintenance. It will reopen on Friday, barring any complications. He reminded citizens the Transfer Station is open on Saturdays from 9:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m.

Phase 1 Comprehensive 2014-2016 Paving Program Update

The City Manager announced the bids were let last week, they are due back by July 30, and he hopes to bring a contract award recommendation to Council's August 4 Regular Meeting. The Program will commence shortly thereafter.

Comments/Questions for City Manager

Transfer Station Closing: The President asked if the Transfer Station was closed any other time this year. The Manager responded it might have been earlier in the year. He said the City agreement with the Ashtabula County Solid Waste District (ACSWD) for the Transfer Station to be open on Saturdays from 9:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m., has been in place most of this year. The President said a resident told him Saturday hours had ceased. The Manager said Saturday openings may or may not come to an end if the ACSWD decides to contract with someone to have recycling bins, again, placed throughout the county.

He said having the Transfer Station open on Saturday has been good for income purposes, as well as giving citizens the opportunity to dispose of items. The revenue has pretty much covered the manpower costs.

The President asked if there will be any interruption in trash pickup when the compactor is down. The Manager responded no.

Yard Waste Bag Bin: The Ward 4 Councilor asked if a bin is locate outside the Transfer Station for citizens to deposit their yard waste bags in. The Manager said there is a trailer sitting outside the gates in front of Public Works, on West 24th Street. On Saturdays it is inside the yard so Sanitation employees may monitor dumping. He reported people have been using it.

Road Conditions: The President reported poor conditions existing on roads scheduled to be paved during the first phase of the 2014-2016 Paving Program: Michigan Avenue (between West 11th & West 13th Street), the corner of West 12th Street & Lake Avenue, and the corner of Ohio Avenue & Carpenter Road.

CITY SOLICITOR'S REPORT - No Report

FINANCE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Formal Legislation Request

The Finance Director formerly requested ORDINANCE NO. 2014-126 AN ORDINANCE TO MAKE SUPPLEMENTAL APPROPRIATIONS IN THE POLICE GRANT, FIRE GRANT, SANITATION, ERIP, PERMANENT IMPROVEMENT AND SELF INSURURANCE FUNDS FOR CURRENT EXPENSES AND OTHER EXPENDITURES OF THE CITY OF ASHTABULA, STATE OF OHIO, FOR THE PERIOD JANUARY 1 THROUGH DECEMBER 31, 2014. Mr. Balog moved, Mr. Pugliese seconded to grant the Finance Director's request. The Director announced none of these appropriations are for the General Fund. The net increase from available unappropriated funds is \$5,000, and is for Sanitation. The total appropriations being requested is \$183,000, for which revenue is coming in. She has made a request to the County Auditor that the amount be added to our estimated resources. The motion CARRIED.

Nuisance Abatement Published in Star Beacon

The Finance Director reported the annual Nuisance Abatement ad was in the newspaper last Friday. She said 'nuisance abatement' refers to an unpaid trash bill, in accordance with the Ohio Revised Code and a City ordinance. She said because the delinquent trash amount is all that is printed in the newspaper, homeowners whose address is listed should call the Finance Department to ensure the full delinquent amount is paid. She said more than likely, if there is a delinquent trash amount there is a delinquent sewer amount, which is not posted in the newspaper.

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CITY COUNCIL COMMITTEE REPORTS and COMMUNICATIONS

Community/Economic Development/Parks & Recreation (Mrs. Misener/Mr. McClure)

The Chair announced no formal actions were taken at the committee's July 14, meeting.

City Programs

The City Manager provided an overview of City programs and the status of each was reviewed. Many of them center around demolitions and revitalization on Bridge Street and Main Avenue. Many of the demolitions are completed.

The Manager told the committee that in 2015, the Comprehensive Housing Improvement Program (C.H.I.P) grant will be applied for again.

The Manager told the committee the Tire Amnesty program was a success. There is a chance we may be able to apply for those grant funds again.

The Chair said as you go around the City, clean up efforts is visible.

Revitalization

Harbor: Lots of revitalization is taking place and will continue for the next couple of years.

Main Avenue: Revitalization efforts are just getting off the ground. At the last Regular Council Meeting, the McKnight Streetscape Plan was approved. It will help secure grants. The County has pledged to help in the efforts to seek funding.

Comprehensive 2014-2016 Paving Plan: The Plan was discussed. By the middle of next month we should see streets being torn up and put back together. This should allow motorists to travel much easier this fall.

Route 11 Industrial Park: There have been some bits. We have tried to get the State of Ohio to waive the \$25,000 per acre parcel fee, which is the required parcel fee as established in the grant we received to construct the Park. The State of Ohio has agreed to consider our request, case-by-case.

Event: This weekend is the Multicultural Festival (July 26 and 27). We hope for good weather and turnout.

Parks & Recreation Board: The Board agreed to go with Mr. Lester's quote on the playground equipment installation at Clifford Kadon Presidential Park. Now when the installation will take place and who will perform it has to be decided.

The Board reported Nappi Field the mulch at Nappi Field needs to be raked to eliminate the formation of puddles.

The Board reported water quality at Walnut Beach is good.

In September, the Board would like to apply for the NatureWorks grant to purchase Walnut Beach playground equipment.

My Neighborhood Group: The Group will have a block party at Clifford Kadon Presidential Park on Saturday, August 9, from 12:00 p.m. to 4:00 p.m. Music will be provided by Area 51. The Chair said there promises to be lots of food and fun, and encouraged attendance.

Finance and Personnel - (Mr. Ducro IV/Mr. Balog)

The Chair announced the committee met on Friday, July 11, and reported the following:

Financials: The year-to-date financials were reviewed. The Finance Director reported we are within budget and nothing stands out.

Formal Legislation Requests: The Chair introduced the following:

ORDINANCE NO. 2014-121 AN ORDINANCE DESIGNATING DEBT SERVICE RETIREMENT FUND #389 TO RECEIVE APPROPRIATIONS TO RETIRE THE CITY'S STATE INFRASTRUCTURE BOND (S.I.B.) INDEBTEDNESS INCURRED FOR THE CITY STREET PAVING PROJECT (Finance Director). Mr. Ducro moved, Mr. Balog seconded to formally present this legislation; motion CARRIED.

ORDINANCE NO. 2014-122 AN ORDINANCE DESIGNATING SPECIAL REVENUE FUND #262 TO RECEIVE GRANT AND MATCHING MONIES USED TO PAY EXPENSES INCURRED IN THE CITY'S RECYCLING PROGRAM (Finance Director). Mr. Ducro moved, Mr. Hamrick seconded to formally present this legislation; motion CARRIED.

ORDINANCE NO. 2014-123 AN ORDINANCE CREATING TWO (2) NEW SPECIAL REVENUE FUNDS FOR GRANT AND MATCHING MONIES FOR THE POLICE AND FIRE DIVISIONS, RESPECTIVELY (Finance Director). Mr. Ducro moved, Mr. Balog seconded to formally present this legislation; motion CARRIED.

Street Lighting Assessment: The term of the existing assessment is scheduled to expire at the end of the year. The Committee voted to bring legislation forward to repeal and renew the assessment.

Mr. Ducro moved, Mr. Balog seconded to repeal, in its entirety, ORDINANCE NO. 2012-38 AN ORDINANCE ENACTING AN AMENDED SPECIAL ASSESSMENT UPON ALL REAL PROPERTY IN THE CITY OF ASHTABULA, OHIO, IN ORDER TO PAY A PORTION OF THE COST OF PROVIDING STREET LIGHTING, effective December 31, 2014; motion CARRIED. The Chair reported the assessment covers only two-thirds of the cost of our street lighting.

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Mr. Ducro moved, Mr. Balog seconded AN ORDINANCE RENEWING, EFFECTIVE JANUARY 1, 2015, AND CONTINUING FOR A PERIOD OF FIVE (5) YEARS, AN EXISTING SPECIAL ASSESSMENT UPON ALL REAL PROPERTY IN THE CITY OF ASHTABULA, OHIO, IN ORDER TO PAY A PORTION OF THE COST OF PROVIDING STREET LIGHTING, effective January 1, 2015. The Ward 4 Councilor asked why the ordinance is being repealed if it runs out. The Solicitor responded that the existing ordinance does not have an expiration date. By default it expires at the end of five years after enactment. Rather than calculate to the day or month, in 2015, when it should occur and then rush to enact a replacement, he recommended to the committee they repeal the existing ordinance and enact it for a period of five years, with a specific December 31 expiration date. The existing legislation was enacted about 4 years ago. The Ward 5 Councilor asked if the amount of the assessment will change. The Solicitor responded it is exactly the same. The motion CARRIED.

Water Pollution Control

The City Manager told the Committee he would bring legislation to Council regarding the Water Pollution Control Final Tanks and the One Ton Chlorine Tanks.

He told the committee there is an issue with the Water Pollution Digester and funding options are being researched.

He updated the committee on activity at the Plant to be addressed in the near future.

Staffing: The Manager told the committee he continues to work on appointing a Public Services Superintendent replacement.

The Manager announced to the committee the appointment of Jeff Gianantonio as the Acting Fire Chief.

Meeting: The Chair announced the committee will meet on Friday, August 8, at 8:00 a.m., in the Municipal Building 2nd floor conference room.

Public Works/Utilities/Schools – (Mr. McClure/Mr. Pugliese)

The Vice Chair announced the committee is scheduled to tentatively meet on Friday, August 1, at 8:00 a.m., in the Municipal Building 2nd floor conference room. The President announced we are waiting to hear from the committee chair to determine if the meeting may take place.

Safety Forces – (Mr. Balog/Mrs. Misener)

The Chair reported on the committee's July 18 meeting, as follows:

Legislation Request: The Chair reported our current legislation requires the Police Chief to reside in the City. When the state changed the residency law allowing employees to live anywhere in the County of Ashtabula or an adjoining county, our legislation was not repealed.

Mr. Balog moved, Mrs. Cook seconded to formally request Ordinance No. 2014-128 AN ORDINANCE REPEALING EXISTING CODIFIED ORDINANCE SECTION 141.10, ENTITLED RESIDENCY REQUIREMENT, AND ENACTING NEW CODIFIED ORDINANCE SECTION 141.10, ENTITLED RESIDENCY REQUIREMENT. The Ward 4 Councilor asked if an employee may live in another state if the adjoining county is in another state. The Solicitor responded that the Ohio Revised Code section, which the Ohio Supreme Court has said trumps municipal charter residency requirements, says an adjoining county 'within the state'. The President said he has heard comments that all city employees should live in the City, and that he would like to see this happen, but that such a rule is not permitted by State law. The motion CARRIED.

Safety Forces

Residency: The Chair reported our Police Chief is a City resident; and that the recently retired Fire Chief Ronald Pristera was also.

Retirement: The Fire Marshall will retire at the end of the year. A senior member of the department is interested in the position.

Acting Fire Chief Appointed: The promotion of Jeff Gianantonio to Acting Fire Chief was briefly discussed.

Chief Appointments: The Manager is working on details concerning future fire chief and possibly police chief appointments.

Codified Ordinance Chapter 511 "Noise Control": We have all been subject to loud 'boom box' music which frequently comes from vehicles. Police Chief Stell told the committee it is a "transient problem" because by the time law enforcement are called and arrive, the noise is gone, which makes it hard to police. The Chief assures local officials his officers stop violators, advise them (when they are witness to it), of the violation, and the blotter report received by the committee showed 23 loud music complaints were reported in 30 days. The President said he believes it is a legitimate concern. He appreciates the blotter report, which shows 136 'loud noise' complaints (e.g., revving of engines, loud parties, etc.) were reported. He said the Chief is working on specifics regarding 'calls for service', such as how many citations were issued for loud noise complaints, to present to the committee. The President said hopefully violators are being cited and changing their behavior because their behavior is hurting their 'pocketbook'. He said everyone is entitled to a warning, but habitual offenders should be held accountable. The Chair said he was told equipment may be confiscated from a vehicle of a repeat 'loud music' offender. The Chair said he gets the noise frequently at his home, has toiled with calling the police but determined it is not worth it because the noise would be gone by the time they arrived. He said it would be nice to catch them going down the road and have them ticketed.

Police Department Appropriations: The Finance Director told the committee the Police Department operating account may need additional funds by the end of the year. It is not a pressing issue, and the spending is not out of the ordinary – just the cost of doing business in the department.

West 50th Street Structure: The State Board of Appeals placed the second highest fine every imposed on a West 50th Street structure, according to the City Manager; however the fine is being appealed. The Chair said his concern is landlords who are not taking care of their properties are putting people's health and safety at risk. He said because of this the City needs to be prompt in enforcing fines.

Monthly Committee Meeting: The new time and date will be the fourth (4th) Monday of each month, at 4:00 p.m. This will accommodate the Ward 5 Councilor whose work schedule does not permit him to make morning meetings. The next meeting will be held on Monday, September 22, and invited the public to attend.

Civil Service Test: The written police entrance test is completed. The next phase is the physical agility testing. A candidate who is being deployed to Afghanistan was going to take the physical agility test before deploying. The other candidates will be encouraged to take the test sooner rather than later.

Questions/Comments for Committee

Loud Music: The Ward 4 Councilor asked for clarification regarding the President's request of the Police Chief for details as to how many citations were issued for loud music. The President said he has asked for the information and the Police Chief is gathering it. The Ward 4 Councilor asked the President to have the Police Chief bring stats to the next committee meeting showing the number of citations issued on certain violations since the last blotter report. The President suggested the request be made of this committee chair or the Manager. The Ward 4 Councilor said she would give her request to either of those persons or the Clerk of Council to present to them.

MISCELLANEOUS

Form & Correctness: The Clerk of Council apologized for not obtaining the Solicitor's approval as to legislation form and correctness prior to the legislation being presented. She asked the Solicitor for said approval. The Solicitor responded with his approval.

Mowing of Private Property: The Ward 2 Councilor asked if the City is permitted to remove fencing on a private property they have to mow because the owner(s) is not doing so. The Solicitor responded, "It will depend on the circumstances. If we have reports of infestation of rodents or animals nesting in the grass and creating a health hazard and we cannot contact the owner, yes, we may remove the fence. If we are just seeking to mow the lawn that two inches higher than permitted, I'm not so sure we are privileged to take down a section of fence to mow, even if we put it back up." It is different when there is an obvious vacant property. The Ward 2 Councilor said he has received a few calls regarding areas which need to be mowed where fences exist. He told the callers the fence is probably why the city has not mowed. He said it is getting to a point where it is getting out of hand. The Solicitor said he understands and has seen such properties himself.

Mrs. Willietta Bunch Marbury: The President reported one of Mrs. Willietta Bunch Marbury's fellow church members told him Mrs. Marbury is retiring after dedicating four years of service as the Director of Christian Education for the Union Missionary Baptist DISTRICT Association, United Missionary Baptist STATE Convention, and LOCALLY for Peoples Missionary Baptist Church. The President commended her for her service and offered sincere CONGRATULATIONS on her retirement.

GENERAL PUBLIC DISCUSSION

Ms. Patricia Blum, 1540 West 17th Street: reported the following:

High Grass: She previously reported the grassy area by the Equalization Basin needed to be cut and that this has not happened. She said because the grass on Michigan Avenue, by her property, is so high pedestrians are cutting through her property to avoid it.

She said she saw someone measuring the height of the grass, but they did not cut it. She expressed extreme frustration over this.

Dr. Raghupathy's office grass is high and asked why it is not cut. She said she paid to have the paper street cleaned up, which is property she and the doctor received after the city vacated the road.

She does what she can, she cuts the 'gully' property owned by the City, and just wished others cared also.
